

A Comparison: Continuing Education — Evening Division and Regular Day Division

In Continuing Education, you will have the opportunity to take concentration as well as general education courses given in the evening and/or on Saturdays. Please note that course selection is limited and full-time status, although possible, is not guaranteed. Science (200PC) or General Social Science (300CG) DEC programs are offered in our Continuing Education Division. The following table explains the differences between registering in an evening DEC program offered in the Continuing Education Division, and in a day program in the Regular Day Division.
